What does baking a cake from scratch have in common with the High Holy Days?

If you ask me, the answer is "They're both something I do once a year." But if you ask get this answer. They both need preparation for success, no matter how good the ingred

Think about it: You can use the best eggs, flour, butter, and whatever else goes into a hawould I know? – but if you don't prepare by preheating the oven, your cake will fail, be the outside but remaining undercooked on the inside.

For the High Holy Days, Kehillah has the best "ingredients" around – a gifted rabbi, fal inspiring prayer books (custom-made by Rabbi Sharfman), and the friendliest congregal prepare, the High Holy Days are likely to miss their mark. Instead of feeling uplifted, re you might just feel confused, bored or frustrated. Or like a cake made without preheatin energy (heat) hitting you on your surface, with too little of it making its way inside, into mind.

Judaism, in its wisdom, has a built-in "preheating" period for the High Holy Days: The which began at sundown on August 31, is meant to filled with self-reflection.
